## Project News:

Our Teleseminars and Webinars are now over for 2007! Congratulations and thanks goes to the:

- 47 people who enrolled in the 5 teleseminars to receive a basic introduction to interprofessional education and collaborative mental health care
- 43 people who enrolled in the 3 webinars to receive instruction and practical tips on how to implement the CCMHI Education Toolkit
- 62 people who enrolled in both a teleseminar and a webinar
- 10 guest presenters for sharing their knowledge and experience from their various perspectives as a consumer, educator, and/or health care provider
- 4 accrediting organizations and 9 endorsing organizations for supporting and recognizing our continuing education seminars

## Your Evaluation:

Your recent feedback about your CCL experience has been encouraging. Here is a snapshot of what we learned from the evaluation surveys we have received to date:

- 91% of respondents felt the CE training resources were “good”, “very good” and “excellent”
- 97% of respondents felt the quality of information provided on the project website was “good”, “very good” and “excellent”
- 85% of respondents provided a positive rating of between “8” and “10” that interprofessional education enhances collaboration among professionals from different disciplines
- 87% respondents provided a positive rating of between “8” and “10” that interprofessional collaboration can improve clinical care for consumers
- Suggestions for program improvements include providing: tips to enhance collaboration, opportunities to connect with others, printer-friendly materials, and brochures & “take-aways”
