“Continuing Education for Collaborative Mental Health Care: An Interprofessional Education Teleseminar”

Our 90-minute teleseminars offer a basic introduction to interprofessional education (IPE) and collaborative mental health care. Each of the five teleseminar sessions will be lead by an interprofessional team of experts (representative of our target audiences), and will engage participants from across Canada. Registration is FREE, and participants only need access to a land telephone anywhere in Canada. Continuing education credits will be provided to a select group of health professionals; all participants will receive a certificate acknowledging their participation. The teleseminars will be recorded live and made available on the project website.

Objectives: 1) To raise awareness and increase use of the [CCMHI Education Toolkit](#); 2) To increase awareness of collaborative mental health care, IPE and collaborative practice; and 3) To increase awareness of the roles/responsibilities of the various mental health and primary health care providers involved in delivering mental health services in primary health care settings.
